





ZooPharmaCognosy (ZPC) is the study of how non-human animals self-medicate. It is derived

action! The actual science of ZPC was legitimized in 1987 when Dr. Eloy Rodriguez and his team, including Dr Norma Pestano coined the term after studying in the Amazon of Peru for over 10 years with Cornell University. ZPC can be broken up into two categories, prophylactic (or preventative) and therapeutic (treating or curing). For example, parasitism is one of the most common ailments wild animals face. An animal can choose a prophylactic approach and can ingest foods that make them more resistant to infection, and/or take a therapeutic approach and consume foods that have antiparasitic properties.<sup>2</sup> How do we know an animal is self-medicating? The biologist, Michael Huffman established the criteria to determine whether an animal is self-medicating while studying great apes. The item cannot be a normal part of the animal's natural diet, it must provide little to no nutritional value, it must be consumed at a specific time, for example, when parasites are most common. And finally, other animals in the group (or in the area) must not be participating in this same behavior (unless they, themselves are suffering the same infliction).<sup>1</sup> Why is ZPC important today? We still have a lot to learn about what the earth can provide for us. Animals continue to adapt to the changing environment, finding new ways to utilize what is available to them. For example, in Mexico, house finches and sparrows will use cigarette butts as a building material for their nests, they specifically used ones that had already been smoked, and made sure to spread the fibers of the filter throughout the nest. But why? In 2012 a team of

scientists from the National Autonomous University in Mexico learned that nicotine, a chemical that is abundant in smoked cigarette butts acts as pest control! Deterring mites and other blood




